## **Open Meeting – Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March**

Our guest speaker at the next open meeting will be Terry Ransom and the title of his talk will be: **Yuri Gagarin and the Chief Designer**.



Once around the Earth at roughly 5 miles per second, this 27-year-old Soviet Cosmonaut became a National Treasure. Quite a lot of us will remember that momentous moment on 12th April 1961 when Yuri Gagarin became the first human to orbit the Earth, but apparently there is a lot more to the story. 1961 was at the height of the 'space race' and 'cold war' and it is only relatively recently that much of his life (and mysterious death) have been disclosed by the Soviet Union. This is a story not to be missed, come along and find out more!

## Be Home Safe scheme

Your Committee welcomed David Raybould from 'Be Home Safe' (previously the 'Bobby Van Man') to the September Committee meeting. Be Home Safe is a free referral service that gives security to victims of crime and helps vulnerable people to stay safe. David does this by providing advice on issues such as home security and installing safety equipment (door locks, door viewers, window locks) free of charge.

Unfortunately, there are no longer sufficient funds to provide proactive assistance which had previously been available and so your Committee has contributed a donation of £250 with the proviso that it should be used to help Nailsea families.
