# **Resolution of the month**

Make sure you have your bank and credit card company's 24-hour contact numbers stored in your phone in case of any emergency.

## **Be Scam Aware**

No one, young or old is exempt from being a victim of fraud. Below are several points to be aware of:

- The age group 45-65 is of particular interest to fraudsters because they are able to access funds from their pension pots and are often looking for attractive investments giving high returns. Although Cold calling regarding pensions is now illegal these calls are continuing to be made and scams are still occurring.
- If you receive a scam email or text message, do not reply or click on any links as this lets scammers know your email address or phone number is active. Delete the email/text or report it as 'spam' and block the sender
- Just because a website has an address ending in .co.uk this does not mean it is necessarily based in the UK. Likewise, scammers can fabricate a caller's ID information that appears on your phone, including dialling codes, so that 020 number that you think is from London could in fact be from anywhere in the world.
- Always access your bank directly via their official website and not via any links in emails purporting to be from the bank. If you want to check by phone always use the number on your bank or credit card, never any included in a text or email.
- Your bank will NEVER ask you to authorise anything by entering your PIN into the telephone.
- If you receive any scam post it should be reported to the Royal Mail. They can be contacted on 08456 113413, email: scam.mail@royalmail.com. Or post to Freepost Scam Mail, PO Box 797, Exeter, EX1 9UN
- If you have Power of Attorney for someone and you are concerned about the risk of them being scammed, then you can apply on their behalf for a Redirection of Mail to your address. This can be done at a Post Office counter or by post.
- MOST IMPORTANTLY- if you have been a victim of a scam or fraud, please report it. Don't be ashamed or embarrassed, it could happen to anyone of us and your report could help catch the people behind it!

If Santa delivered a 'smart' device that was not on your Christmas list and you plan to return it to the elves do not forget to do a 'factory reset'. This will remove all your personal data and return it to its original settings. Details on how to do this will be found on the manufacturer's website.
