We are now being directed by our local Police station to the website www.Police.uk to obtain our crime report. The information on this website is updated on or before the last working day of each month and will map reported incidents in the preceding month.

Another useful website is UKCrimeStats.com, which gives lists of crime figures, maps and statistics. All relevant information from these websites is regularly collated and added to the Nailsea NHW website www.nailseanhw.org.uk

Rogue Tradespeople

We were pleased to welcome PC Ross Kirby from Clevedon at the last Open Meeting in May. He gave us an update on local policing matters - especially the matter of rogue doorstep tradesmen. Scams in various forms continue to trick many innocent people and show no signs of abating.



At this time of year, be more cautious of the 'tradesperson' knocking on your front door, offering to do a job (often in the garden or outside house maintenance) for a bargain price.

Rogue traders will have little if any ID and so are usually untraceable. Just remember:

- Do not agree to anything on the spot however persuasive they are - and they can be very persuasive
- Be wary of any warnings or claims they make e.g. telling you that your house looks unsafe
- Do not pay any money up front and do not go to the bank or cash point if they offer to take you
- If what they are offering sounds too good to be true it probably is!

If you have been a victim of a doorstep rogue trader or are suspicious of any tradesmen please ring 111. If the suspect person(s) are still in the street, or you are concerned for the safety of any of your neighbours ring 999.
