We will be welcoming our new guest speaker Ms. Sarah Hearne to our next Open meeting. She will be giving us a talk titled 'Travels of a Marine Biologist'. The oceans cover more than 70% of our planet and are coming under increasing threat from human activity, but how do we figure out how to best protect them? Sarah will explain how researchers study these environments using stories from her life as a fisheries observer in the Falkland Islands and her current PhD research based in Australia.

Crime Report You may have noticed a reduction in the number of local Police Alerts lately. This is due to the sudden unexpected retirement of the North Somerset NHW Police administrator at the end of March. This means a reduced service to NHW Schemes until a replacement has been recruited. Delivery Scam

There have been reports of people receiving delivery notes appearing to be from Royal Mail or other couriers, saying they have tried to deliver a parcel and to call a phone number to arrange an alternative delivery date.

In the scam the number is a premium charge one and people have lost considerable amounts of money.

If you are expecting a delivery always check the phone number either from the company's website or use the phone book.

May Meeting Update

Ashley Jones on behalf of Senior Citizen Liaison Team gave a very interesting talk on 'Senior Safety' at our May Open meeting. Scams and fraud now make up a staggering 42% of the total crime (including robbery, drugs related crime and murder) reported in this country.

He recommended that we stick to the old adage of:

'If it looks too good to be true then it is more likely to be a scam'





Telephone scams to be aware of

- Calls asking for money to renew your 'Telephone Preference Service Registration': This is actually a free service with no renewal charge and no need to update
- Calls from companies selling 'anti scam technology'
- Calls from 'charities' asking for donations to support scam victims
- Cold calls about pensions are now illegal but fraudsters are still making calls. If you receive one, report it to either the Information Commissioner's Office on 0303 123 1113 or online at ico.org.uk
- With mobile phones, never reply to spam messages, this includes messages asking you to text 'STOP' to cancel them. This will only let them know that your number is active. Only legitimate marketing and advertising sites text messages can be cancelled in this manner
- Forward any spam text messages (including the sender's number) to your Network provider so they can block it for you
