April has seen a slow return to normal neighbourhood policing activities which has seen the Nailsea beat team engaging with Community Speedwatch and also hold a bike marking event in Millennium Park where over 100 bikes were registered on the Bike Register scheme.

During April with the improving weather and longer days we have noticed a rise in incidents of underage drinking, some of which have involved campfires. The areas affected have included Nowhere Wood, Golden Valley Fields and the Grove sports playing fields and Morgan's Hill area. We have implemented regular patrols of these areas when duties permit with a view to engaging and educating.

We are particularly concerned as one of these fires in Nowhere Wood required Avon Fire to attend and deal as there was a serious risk of the fire spreading due to the unusually dry spell we have had in April.



Late April saw the return of the Fair to Nailsea and at the time of this newsletter going out it has been very well attended and the atmosphere has been brilliant. We hope that this is another sign of normality returning and that more events can take place safely and the Summer can be an enjoyable one for the community.

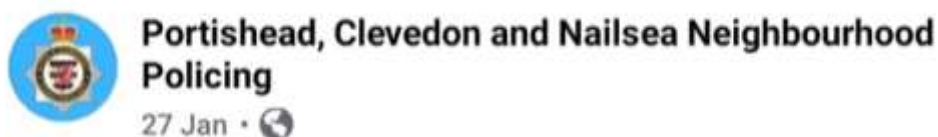
