

Charity Scams at Christmas

Charity Scams happen all year round but during the Festive season we tend to receive more requests for money; especially through the post, on the street and from door-to-door collectors.

There are two main types of scams to watch out for:

- 1. Scammers that create a false charity and then request donations
- 2. Scammers who present as collecting on behalf of a genuine charity but pocket the donations

Legitimate charities will have a charity number that can be checked on the Charity Commissions website. Street collectors must carry their Official Charity identification which you can ask to see.

Nationwide Increase in Theft of Catalytic Convertors

Theft of catalytic converters has been increasing over the last year due to the soaring prices of the precious metals contained in them (rhodium, platinum and palladium).

Hybrid cars are more likely to be targeted as the converters on these vehicles are in better condition (they are not in use when the vehicle is running on electricity). Vans and 4x4 vehicles are also frequent victims as they have a higher ground clearance.

One of our members had their converter stolen when parked at Long Ashton Park & Ride at the end of September. According to the Police, six vehicles (five of them hybrids) were targeted that same afternoon within a 3-hour period.

The Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 made it illegal to pay cash for scrap metal without recording the transaction. There are however unlicensed yards that do accept these stolen converters and so the thefts will continue.

Suggestions to limit risk:

- If possible, park close to fences, walls or kerbs with the exhaust closest to that side to prevent access from underneath
- 2. Security lighting, CCTV and alarms may all deter thieves
- 3. Engrave your converter with your car registration number or VIN number
- 4. Fit a protective covering over the converter
- Park in a secure garage while at home, converters have been stolen from cars parked on owners drives

According to the Police, Park & Ride and Public car parks (including hospitals) are popular sites for this crime.

Bristol City Council have confirmed that there are no staff continually on site at the three Bristol Park & Rides however, they have regular patrols throughout the day and 24-hour CCTV coverage that is regularly monitored.
