Scams – Some points to remember

- 1. Bank staff and Police Officers will **never** ask you to move money to a safe account
- 2. Do not click on links or attachments in emails and texts you were not expecting
- 3. Do not assume a phone call or email is genuine even if they know your name and address. This type of information can be easily obtained by fraudsters
- 4. An offer of a free pension review from a company you don't normally deal with is quite likely to be a scam
- 5. Always check everything yourself, even if a friend or relative thinks it's all genuine. They may have been unwittingly scammed themselves

On social media, be careful about how much sensitive information you are sharing. Holiday photos tell a burglar that there is an empty property and photos of driving licences, passports, credit cards etc. may contain enough information for someone to steal your ID
